On Seminole Indian lands-Snake Road there is a chance for Crested Caracara, Wild Turkey, White-tailed Kite and Sandhill Cranes. (\$80) PALM BEACH WETLANDS, Wacodahachee, Green Cay & Okeehchee- At Okeehchee possible Painted Bunting & Sand-hill Crane. Green Cay wetlands' attracts Limpkin, Purple Gallinule, & Sora. Wacodahachee harbors Black-bellied Whistling Ducks, American Bittern and much more. At the famous historical Clewiston Inn we will have a yummy late lunch with all southern sides and charm. Two stops to see the second largest freshwater lake in the U.S-Lake Okeechobee. Cost-\$90 SOUTH DADE EXOTICS & WETLANDS South Dade is home to some of the most sought after birds Red-whiskered Bulbul, Spot-breasted Oriole, and Hill Myna. A stop at AD Barnes for wintering warblers, possible White-crowned Pigeon, and Bell's Vireo. Lunch at nature center. Old Cutler Wetlands and Dump Marsh can have some rare birds such as Short-tailed Hawk. . Cost:\$75. 8 Required min.</p>
<p>SUN.-1/20 6:15-check in, 6:30-day orientation, 7:00 a.m.- late return</p>	<p>EVERGLADES NATIONAL PARK The ENP tour will start at Lucky Hammock for White-tailed Kite, Grasshopper Sparrow, up to 10 species of raptors and wintering warblers. A quick stop at the visitors center for a peek. Anhinga trail offers close views of wading birds, Purple Gallinules and Short-tailed Hawk. A picnic lunch at Long Pine Key can bring Eastern Bluebird, Brown-headed Nuthatch and Eastern Towhee. A few quick stop at Paurotis, Mrazek, and Eco-Ponds for Roseate Spoonbills and much more. At Flamingo look on the sandbar for Black Skimmer, Reddish Egret, White Pelican, Marbled Godwit and many shorebirds. The easiest place in the U.S. to see Crocodiles can be found at Flamingo. Schedule may vary on tide and rare bird alerts. Cost-(\$75)</p>

The Florida Keys Wildlife Center is a great place to see a variety of birds up close for comparison and possible Great White Heron, Horned Grebe & others. John Pennekamp State Park will include a short hike in the one of the U.S.'s most endangered habitats-tropical hardwood forest and time to see the displays and aquarium of the U. S's only coral reef system. A late lunch at the world's famous Alabama Jack's waterfront restaurant for conch fritters & chowder to get the real atmosphere of the Keys. (\$90)</p>
